

WINTER IS FOR BUILDING



It is a fact of life that the current popularity of R/C airplanes is due to the availability of "Ready to Fly" (RTF's) and "Almost Ready to Fly" (ARF's) airplanes. This has been a real boost to a declining model airplane industry and you'll see most of the planes flown at the local flying fields to be this type of plane. There is, however, still some that feel that designing and building an airplane is at least as challenging and as much fun as flying it. Starting with a blank sheet of paper, Don Johnson selected the Bellanca Air Bus (circa 1927-30) because of its unusual shape and features. The struts are streamlined aluminum tubing, rigging is spider wire, wheel pants are fiberglass cloth and epoxy over a wood form, cowl is a couple of Coke cans, the cowl ring is from a PET 7-up bottle and the 9 cylinder Wright Cyclone is hand made (see page 5 for a close up shot). It's electric of course and with all the stuff hanging from a long nose the battery is behind the cabin section, With a 48.5 inch wing span it is 1/16 th scale. Will it fly? We'll soon see as it is about ready to cover.

MEETING MINUTES TRI-LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB January 9, 2007

President Gary Acton opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. at the Branson RecPlex. All officers were present. There were 16 members and member's wife, Janet Woods in attendance. There were no new members or guests in attendance. The minutes from the December meeting were approved as published in the January newsletter. Treasurer Erv Rohde reported that the current treasury balance was \$2139.03 and 18 members have paid current to date. The 50/50 raffle was won by Jack McEvoy who received one half of \$13.

Committee Reports:

There were no committee reports for this meeting.

Announcements and Old Business:

Gary Acton brought a letter from Skaggs Hospital Chaplain Mary Helen Jeruzal thanking all of the members who donated the stuffed toys for Christmas and said how much they were needed and appreciated. Gary also reported on his visit to an R/C club in Ocala, Fla. over the holidays and how their 120 members have built their club treasury and actually vie with each other to help with the mowing chores, etc.

Everyone is reminded again, when locking the gatebe sure to put our lock through another lock-NOT the chain. It will be cut off!

New Business:

The following members have accepted the board members request to fill these important positions for 2007: Safety officer-Gene Fuson, Fun Fly Director-Don Johnson and Field Marshal-Fritz Corbin..

Gary thanked out-going Vice President and Field Marshal Bud Austin and Safety Officer, John Woods for their help and excellent service the past year. Everyone also wanted Don Johnson to know that his hard and diligent work with the Newsletter and all the certificates that he makes for us was greatly appreciated and such an asset to the club.

Treasurer Erv Rohde asked that a "backup" for the treasurers duties be available. He will be unable to perform regular duties from June until August 1st. Howard Shire volunteered to fill in for him.

A discussion was held regarding Club shirts, having an inventory on hand for new members and for members who need replacements. It was decided that Erv Rohde is to obtain a supply so that these will be available in the future. We still have 1 large and 1 extra large red shirt available. It was agreed that all future shirts will be ordered in royal blue as we had done in the past. This will help to eliminate having "odd ball" sizes/colors on hand and to add to continuity of the club's appearance.

Discussion regarding the upkeep of the field, the areas that need to be mowed, etc. ensued. Motion by Howard Shire, 2nd by Jack McEvoy to authorize Fritz Corbin to purchase the necessary chemicals to keep insect problems from occurring-passed unanimously.

Program:

Dave Medley passed out the New Year's Day Flying certificates to the following (who were in attendance at the meeting) 17 pilots who participated: Bud Austin, Fritz Corbin, Roscoe Fudge, Gene Fuson, Jim Halbert, Don Johnson, Joe Major, Jack McEvoy, Annette McEvoy, Tom McKenzie, Dave Medley, Keith Oxby, Henry Racette, Erv Rohde, Howard Shire, Janet Woods and John Woods.

A flyer was passed out to each person in attendance to be used as a guideline for the talk that John Woods gave on safety issues, how it affects each and every one of us and how we are all responsible not only for ourselves but for every other person at the field. He pointed out that each of us has, at some time or another, made at a mistake that was or could have been a serious problem for ourselves or someone else at the field. John mentioned that the flyer listed 7 major items but that there are many more things that go into maintaining a safe flying environment for all of us. Dave Medley reminded everyone again about the proper use of the frequency board and making sure that you do not turn on your radio unless you are in possession of the pin for that frequency. Dave also passed out a check list for everyone to use when doing a pre-flight on their aircraft.

Gene Fuson brought his beautiful Aero Marine r/c boat which runs a hopped up Z260 (marine G26), has a tattle-tale tack so he can see how high he's revved the ported & big bore 6 hp engine. It can run close to 60 mpg and up to 15,000 rpm. Gene uses a recoil starter to get this water cooled, tuned pipe engine to start & keeps the 16# beauty running with a 16 oz load of gas. The beautiful finish was applied by a professional using automotive paint. Gene nearly wiped out the \$1800 investment by a run-in with a turtle!

Don Johnson brought everyone up to date with the progress on his Bellanca project. He's made great inroads on the engine which uses a 7-Up bottle for the cowl ring. The cylinders are balsa that he made using sharp tubing. The rocker boxes were then molded using modeling clay for a mold and the actual parts are then molded from an epoxy and micro-balloons mix. Don uses silicon spray as a mold release. The exhaust ring is made from aluminum tubing and is very realistic. He made the pants by laying out fiberglass cloth, spraying it with 3M Super 77, letting it dry, placing it over a form to shape and then brushes on epoxy to complete. The finished product is so scale like.

Next meeting will be February 13th at the Branson RecPlex center.
