Under Article III a : Membership. I would suggest the following:

Youth Membership: Youth mem-4. bers will be categorized as an individual who is 18 years of age or younger. Youth membership will be \$15.00 per year and the individual will have full membership rights.

Guest: Guest who want to fly at 5. our field must be accompanied by a Club member. The Guest Flyer will be limited to two visits, and then they must apply for a Guest membership and pay a membership fee of \$7.00 per month. Guest flyers must be a current AMA member. Guest Flyers who are not a member of AMA may only fly with an Instructor Pilot with an Intro Pilot status using a buddy box.

In checking with other Clubs I have found that most of the suggested changes are included in their bylaws. We have not reviewed or changed our bylaws since 1998 therefore I feel they need a thorough review and revision. At the next meeting I would like to open up discussion of the above revisions and changes. If the Club feels the changes should be made bylaws, I will appoint an individual to alter the bylaws and present the changes to the Club for approval.

APRIL 2010 FUN FLY

It was a good looking day with the the temperature in the high 60s. The breeze was a little stiff at times but not enough to bother the eager pilots.

Erv Rohde was the chef of the day cooking up the usual hot dogs with chips and sodas. The ladies also put on the finishing touch with a lemon cake, chocolate pie and chocolate chip cookies. It doesn't get any better than that.

After lunch there was a pilot's meeting at 12:30 where eight anxious pilots got their instructions on the events to follow. This was one more participant than at any Fun Fly last year.

The first event was TIMED FLIGHT WITH LOOPS AND ROLLS. Take off and do as many loops and rolls as possible and land in exactly 60 seconds. Receive 5 points for each loop and roll and a 1 point penalty for each second over or under 60 seconds. Also a 20 second penalty for landing off the runway. Time starts when plane starts to move and stops when plane stops. High score wins. Bud Austin had the best flight of the day by doing 7 loops and rolls with only a 4 second time penalty for 31 total points. Howard Shire took second place with 10 loops and rolls and a 25 second penalty for 25 points and John Woods was third with 6 loops and rolls with a 6 second penalty for 24 points. Erv Rohde was forth with 23 points and Fritz Corbin was fifth with 18 points. President, Dave Medley, added some excitement to the event by going full power into the safety fence and did not finish the event.

The next event was ERV'S GROUND TAR-GETS. Time starts when you touch starting line between two targets. Knock over 2 targets, come back and knock over one starting line target. Continue to knock over 2 more targets, then back to the starting line. Knock over remaining starting line target and clock stops. Penalties: 5 seconds if you break a piece into 2 pieces. 10 seconds if you get airborne. 15 seconds if you destroy a stick; (more than 2 pieces). 20 seconds if you don't follow the rules. ONE WITH LEAST SECONDS WINS. First place was again Bud Austin with a time of 51 seconds and no penalties. Second went to John Woods with a run of 59 seconds and one 5 second penalty for a net 64 seconds and third was Homer Zobel with a 72 second run and 10 second penalty for a net 82 seconds. Forth was Howard Shire with a net 89 seconds and fifth was Erv Rohde with a 102.

The last event was TIMED TOUCH AND GO LANDINGS. Make five touch and go landings in possible time. the shortest All take-offs and landings will be made into the wind or in a direction indicated by the event director. At least one main landing gear wheel must touch the runway to be counted as a landing. Only one landing per pass. Timing will start when the throttle is opened for take-off and will stop at touch down after the fifth take-off has been completed. The shortest time will determine the winner. A four-minute time limit is placed on the event. Engine restarts are allowed. Bud Austin was again the hot pilot with a time of 77 seconds with Fritz Corbin second at 89 seconds and in third place was Homer Zobel with 102 seconds. Forth place went to Don Johnson with 118 seconds and fifth was Erv Rohde with 119 seconds. John Woods looked like he had a good flight going but lost his muffler causing a power loss and did not finis the event.

The Overall Winner was obviously Bud Austin in winning all three events and receiving 300 Top Gun 2010 points. Second overall went to John Woods with 130 Top Gun points and in third place was Howard Shire with 110 pints. Fourth place was a tie between Fritz Corbin and Homer Zobel with 100 points each.

Many thanks to all that helped and contributed to the success of the Fun Fly.

The next scheduled Fun Fly will be June 13th.

SAFETY FIRST

For the next few months we will be reviewing the club safety rules and regulations as adopted by the Club on October 1997 and revised on 5-12-98.

1. All members are expected to know and adhere to the SAFETY RULES set down by the TRI-LAKES R/C FLYING CLUB and the ACADEMY OF MODEL AERONAUTICS (AMA) and to use common sense when operating or observing any R/C aircraft.

2. Pilots must be insured by the AMA and have in their possession their current AMA identification card.

3. Guests of Club members must be AMA members and may use the flying field for a period of two weeks. If guests exceed the two-week period they will be required to purchase an Associate Membership.
