

Based on a Four Star-40 plan, Don Johnson's mock PT-19 first flew in July of '03 with a geared electric motor and a couple of pounds of nicads. After 36 flights, in April of '08, it was converted to a brushless motor with a 3 cell li-po battery as shown in the upper left photo and flew with much better performance. On New Year's Day, 2011, it crashed due to a broken aileron horn and servo gear, probably hanger rash. It then had 96 flights on it. The mid right photo shows it stripped down, repaired and with a new fuselage. It now is back flying as a front line fighter in the proud colors of the Banana Republic on some island way south of here. The change also included upgrading to a Spektrum radio system.

TRI-LAKES RC FLYING CLUB

April 12, 2011

President Howard Shire opened the meeting at 6:01 PM, at the Coachlight Clubhouse. All Officers were present. There were 10 members present including the officers. There were no guests at the meeting. Howard Shire won the 50/50 split the pot. He received \$4.50 of the \$9 pot.

Committee Reports:

Treasurer Roy Steinestel reported that there was \$1,803.80 in the bank on April 1st. Roy also reported that he, Erv Rohde and Howard Shire had met with the IRS and were told to get a 990-N form off the internet and fill it out. This was done and the IRS responded by email that our tax reporting obligation was complete and accepted for this year.

Old Business:

It was reported that the Civil Air Patrol had made no contact about an indoor flight demo at the Branson West airport. Dave Medley said he talked to the Airport Manager and said he was not in favor of any R/C flying

Dave Medley said he had not yet contacted the Cub Scout or LUC boys ranch about a flight demo day but would do so.

New Business:

Fritz Corbin presented a detailed proposal and cost estimate, along with a pass out, on redoing the safety fence. The estimated cost of replacing the fence was \$318.03. After considerable discussion, it was decided to continue the discussion at next Month's meeting.

Fritz Corbin said that most members do not change the combination on the gate lock when opening the gate thereby leaving the combination for anyone to see. Since the combination has to be changed before it can be re-locked anyway, he suggested it would be good to change the combination immediately after opening the lock.

The Club roster has been updated for 2011 and it was suggested that it be emailed to all current members. Don Johnson said he would do that and have the Club web site also updated.

Program:

Gene Fuson handed out New Year's Day and Fun Fly certificates to John Woods and Bud Austin who had been absent when they were first passed out.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:02 PM.
