

The AMA does allow an exception. This is the Intro Pilot Program where for recruiting new members or public relations, designated Intro Pilots can allow non AMA members to fly at the Club field via a Buddy-Box system. Yes. AMA paper work is required on these flights. The Club has three Intro Pilots, Erv Rohde, Howard Shire and John Woods. If you know someone that wants to try a hand at R/C flying, get in touch with one of these Into Pilots to arrange a flying session.

When? JUNE 12TH BBQ starts at noon Pilot's meeting at 12:30 PM

There will be three events.

Event 1. FLIGHT PLAN A. Taxi through the Start-Finish line (purple pylons) (time starts) and through down wind pylons (yellow pylons). Turn around and taxi back through down wind and Start-Finish pylons and take off. Do a loop, stall and a roll then land. Taxi through Start-Finish and down wind pylons then back through the down wind pylons and through the Start Finish pylons (time Stops). Low time wins. 10 second penalty for each pylon knocked down or becoming airborne before the Start line on take-off. A 30 second penalty will be assessed for each maneuver not completed satisfactorily or not going through a set of pylons. Restarts are allowed but only 4 minutes will be allowed to complete the event.

Event 2. JOHN'S TIMED TOUCH & GOES. The pilot performs as many Touch & Go maneuvers as possible in 3 minutes. Time starts when plane moves. Most T&G's in 3 Minutes wins.

Event 3. SPEEDY GONZALES Put plane on plate on runway and take off. Time starts when plane moves. Do a roll, do a roll and loop, then do two loops, then land and stop on plate. Time stops when plane stops while touching plate. Shortest time wins. Twenty point penalty for not completing any of the three maneuvers satisfactorily—judges decision. Restarts are allowed but only 4 minutes will be allowed to complete the event.

Pilots can use any fixed wing aircraft they want in any event.

- 6. All radio equipment should be ground range checked before the first flight of a new or repaired model.
